## **RULES FOR PRIVATE FOUNDATIONS & PUBLIC CHARITIES**

## You should ask the following questions when considering whether an activity violates the electioneering prohibition.

- 1. Does the activity or work product mention candidates, elections, or voting explicitly?
- 2. Is the activity close in time to an election?
- 3. Does the private foundation or public charity have a track record of doing this kind of activity outside election season?
- 4. Does the activity benefit one candidate or party at the expense of another?
- 5. Does the activity involve an issue that has been identified with one candidate or party during the campaign?
